Who is Michael the Archangel?



Michael the Archangel is Jesus. But why this conclusion? Doesn't it say in the Bible "archangel"?

Let's go through a few points from the Bible that prove Michael the Archangel is Jesus:

Jesus is described as an Archangel.

In John 5:24, it is said the Lord's word's raises the dead. In 1 Thessalonians 4:16, the Lord descends from heaven with a shout and the voice of the archangel, and we know that it is Jesus who comes to Earth at the second coming. According to these verses Jesus is the archangel.

Michael is an Archangel

In Jude 1:9, Jude talks about an archangel warring with the devil and he gives His name, Michael.

The men of Daniel and Revelation

In Daniel 10, Daniel sees what he calls "a certain man." He then describes him, and the description of the "certain man" is like the description in Revelation 1:12-16 that describes Jesus. Also mentioned is a man called "one like the similitude of the sons of men." This man helped Daniel and gave him strength after his vision. Then, in the end of the chapter, he mentions another man with him, "Michael your prince". We know that there were only two men with Daniel in this chapter, so the similitude man must be saying that the "certain man" and Michael are the same. Therefore, Jesus must be Michael.

Michael is the name of Jesus before His incarnation

Revelation 12:7 says, "And there was war in heaven: Michael and his angels fought against the dragon, and the dragon fought and his angels." The only time that there was war in heaven was before the erth was created, when Satan rebelled against God. Michael must then be Jesus fighting against Satan. Also mentioned in Daniel 10 was Michael, or Jesus. This was before his incarnation as a human. Michael the archangel is also mentioned in Jude 1:9 in a dispute between him and the devil over Moses's body. We know that this happened before Jesus's incarnation because Moses appeared at the Mount of Transfiguration.

Jesus is the name He received after being born

In Matthew 1:21, the angel Gabriel tells Mary to name her son Jesus "for He shall save His people from their sins." Also in Philipians 2:9
